## Step 1

Organize into pairs. One at a time, spend 10-15 minutes exploring the *Camera Picta* (painted room) on your. You can either create a private room or enter the shared classroom. While one student is in the VR world, the other will read the primary source reader and begin thinking about the questions. Then you will switch roles.

## Step 2

After you have both explored the VR room, answer the following questions.

How would you describe the fictive architecture of this room?


The wedding accounts in the Primary Source reader include descriptions of two weddings. How does the architecture described in those accounts mirror the painted architecture? Both accounts describe a tribunal (stage) where notable guests and dignitaries were seated to observe performances. When you stand in the room what do you see happening? What is the main attraction that has everyone's attention? And who is looking at whom?

How is this room like a theatre?

According to Mantegna's letter, what were some of the challenges of being a court artist?


